RESOLUTION CONCERNING ENERGY EFFICIENCY

WHEREAS all jurisdictions are concerned about climate change and agree energy efficiency and conservation are important components in their plans to meet their shared greenhouse gas emissions reduction targets; and

WHEREAS considerable opportunities exist to improve energy efficiency and conservation in homes, buildings, transportation and industry; and

WHEREAS education and awareness are key components in improving energy efficiency and conservation across all sectors.
